Sculpture is an artistic form in which hard or soft materials are worked into three-dimensional objects
Some sculptures are purely aesthetic, some may have a
An artist is a person who makes paintings or drawings as a profession or hobby
Skills and media are choices that an artist has made for their art .
Artwork in response to the work of another artist can be made from a variety of media
Malleable materials can be manipulated to sculpt art such as clay, wire, foil
Pinch is to grip tightly
Roll is to move in a particular direction by turning over and over
It can be made from a single material or different ones attached together
Sculptures can be any size
Look at artwork and comment on the colours, pattern and shape. Why have the artists chosen them? Aesthetics or purpose?
Materials can be joined by glues, tape, joints .
Liquid clay can be made by adding a small amount of water to clay and rubbing it.
A tool is a piece of equipment you can use. Tools can be used to join and change materials such as craft knives, hand saws, glue guns, rolling pins .
Art appreciation involves discussion around a piece of art - likes, dislikes

Andy Goldsworthy
 A British sculptor and environmental artist whose artworks are inspired by nature and the landscape around us. He creates temporary sculptures using natural materials such as leaves, stones, ice, and branches, often arranged directly in outdoor environments. His work highlights the beauty of natural patterns .

A microhabitat is a small habitat within a larger habitat where smaller living things live e.g. a decomposed log in woodland.

An animal's habitat provides the food it needs to survive







