OUR SCHOOL RESULTS 2023

The information below compares the attainment of our pupils with national averages. We are delighted with the fantastic results across all key stages. They are a tribute to the children, staff (past and present), parents and governors.

Early Years Foundation Stage

80% of pupils in Foundation 2 attained a Good Level of Development against the Early Years Framework. This is above the national average of 765% (2022 national figure as 2023 national data has not been published). A Good Level of Development (GLD) is defined as children working at the expected standard or exceeding the expected standard in the key areas of literacy, maths, physical development, communication and language and personal, social and emotional development.

Year One Phonic Screening

93% of pupils in Year One attained the expected standard in the Phonic Screening test. This is above the national average of 75% (2022 national as 2023 figure is not yet published).

Key Stage One At the end of KS1 (Year 2), teachers are required to assess each child in the areas of reading, writing, and maths. National Curriculum assessment tests are used to support teachers' judgements. The current measures are as follows:

- Expected Standard – Working at the expected standard for a child at the end of Year 2.
- Greater Depth – Working at greater depth within the expected standard, with a strong understanding of the curriculum.

Attainment in Year 2 is strong. Performance is above the national average in every subject area at both the Expected Standard and at Greater Depth (other than writing).

Year 4 Multiplications Check

Children in Year 4 are assessed on their knowledge of times tables. Children have 7 seconds to answer 25 random multiplication questions, entering them into a computer. There is no pass mark published and a mark is given out of 25.

Our MTC results are well above the National Average for the second consecutive year.

Key Stage Two

Children in Year 6 are also assessed on their knowledge and understanding of the curriculum. The curriculum introduced in 2014 provides greater challenge with higher expectations set for the end of KS2. The results of the SATs (tests) are reported using a scaled score, where a score of 100 represents the expected standard. The highest possible score is 120 and the lowest is 80. Children are awarded one of the following Teacher Assessment judgements in writing:

- Expected Standard - Working at the expected standard for their age.
- Greater Depth - Working at greater depth within the expected standard and has a strong understanding of the curriculum.

In addition to these measures and in line with requirements, we have reported the percentage of children achieving a High Standard. Children with a scaled score of 110 and above are included in this group. Year 6 pupils were assessed in reading, writing, grammar, punctuation and spelling (EGPS) and maths.

Our Key Stage 2 results are, once again, extremely pleasing at the end of KS2. Mapplewells pupils performed well above the national average in all subject areas. Work is already underway identifying school improvement priorities for 2023/20 so that our children continue to receive the best possible education and our school continues to go from strength to strength.
