- Can talk about sexual development using the correct vocabulary to describe themselves and their bodies.
- Understand consent and how this is exercised.
- Name a range of job, hobbies or vocations that they aspire to.
- Understand the value (and dangers) of money.

- Recall the key knowledge they have been taught each year.
- Discuss and people who love and care for us and how they do this.
- Describe ways to make people feel good.
- Identify a trusted adult and know how to report concerns.
- Talk about what bullying is (and is not) and how to report to it.
- Identify parts of body, including external genitalia.
- Understand permission seeking and privacy.
- Describe what happens if you eat too many unhealthy foods.
- Understand that people feel sad about loss/death.
- Identify dangers of medicines.
- Take appropriate action if an accident occurs (e.g. call 999).
- Recognise different roles and responsibilities in their community.
- Describe the basic rules of online safety.
- Recognise not everything online is true.
- Understand the need/want difference.
